Current Population

- Partner facilities – 45 plus St. Vincent Island and Sandy Ridge.
- Wolves in the SSP – 245 (plus 2 on St. Vincent Island and 1 at Sandy Ridge)
- Births – 31 pups in 10 litters. 18 DNS leaving 23 pups in 6 litters
 - 2 litters not carried full term
 - 4 pups fostered to wild wolf leaving **19 added to population**
- Deaths– 19 adults
 - since 8/1/20



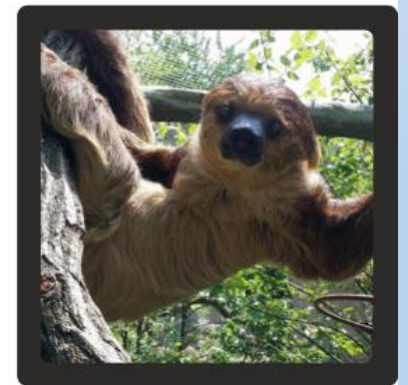
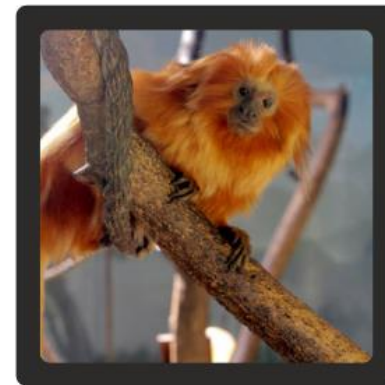
