RED WOLVES' LAST STRONGHOLD

Wildlands Network produced a professional film highlighting the findings from the wildlife camera trapping project we conducted on private and public lands throughout the Albemarle Peninsula. The footage illustrates the abundance of biodiversity- including lots of white tailed deer- found in red wolf territory.

Since the film's release in June, it has been viewed more than 70,000 times by locals within the recovery area, students and staff at North Carolina academic institutions, and Wildlands Network's broader international community of supporters. We intend to continue elevating the film in 2022 online and at events within the 5-county recovery area.

LANDOWNER OUTREACH

We are resuming in person local outreach efforts in the Albemarle Peninsula. Since our wildlife camera trapping project involved private landowners who were willing to setup our cameras out on their land, we want to continue developing these relationships. The hope is they will be interested in signing up for FWS' Prey for the Pack. This is a promising group to work with considering they all own land and they're aware that the data is used for red wolf advocacy.

HWY 64 SAFETY

Wildlands Network will use our NC road prioritization map to elevate the importance of improving Highway 64 safety for animals (broadly) and humans in the local community and with state government officials.
