- Dedicated to protecting, conserving, and restoring NC wildlife and habitat
- Consists of staff, BOD, statewide chapter network, members, volunteers, and affiliated groups
- 19 staff (offices in Raleigh and Charlotte)



North Carolina Wildlife Federation Programs and Partnerships

NCWF partners with state and federal agencies, NGO's, local communities, private landowners and others to work on...

- Native plant and pollinator conservation through Garden for Wildlife programs, Butterfly Highway
 - Deer management and donation to protect habitat and feed those in need
 - National forest planning
 - Assisting with private land management programs
 - Advocating for policies that increase wildlife conservation funding and improve species management
 - Conservation and expansion of NC's elk population
 - Advocating for public trust resources
 - Access to the outdoors for all

Red Wolf Conservation

- **Fire Break Project**
 - Assisting in Pocosin Lakes National Wildlife Refuges fire break restoration with the added benefit of improving habitat for red wolves
- **Prey for the Pack**
 - Cost-share program for private landowners to implement habitat improvement projects within the Red Wolf Recovery Area
- Purchase road signs to reduce red wolf mortality while working on crossing structure and connectivity projects to benefit numerous species
